**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF  
MARATHON, FLORIDA, ADOPTING THE NATIONAL INCIDENT  
MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (NIMS) AS SPECIFIED IN THE HOMELAND  
SECURITY PRESIDENTIAL DIRECTIVE (HSPD)-5**

**WHEREAS**, on February 28, 2003, the President issued Homeland Security President Directive (HSPD)-5; and

**WHEREAS**, management of Domestic Incidents, which directs the Secretary of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS); and

**WHEREAS**, the NIMS will enable responders at all levels to work together more effectively and efficiently to manage domestic incidents no matter what the cause, size or complexity, including catastrophic acts of terrorism and disasters; and

**WHEREAS**, HSPD-5 requires Federal departments and agencies to make adoption of the NIMS by State and local organizations a condition for Federal preparedness assistance (through grants, contracts, and other activities) beginning in FY 2005.



**Section 1.** Council adopts the National Incident Management System (NIMS) under the Homeland Security Presidential Directive (HSPD)-5.

**Section 2.** This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.


