## CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA RESOLUTION 2007-116

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA APPROVING THE RANKINGS OF THE NON-RESIDENTIAL PERMIT ALLOCATION SYSTEM (NROGO) FOR PERIOD 2, YEAR 3 PURSUANT TO ORDINANCE 2004-012 AND 2006-29 OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA

WHEREAS, on 20<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2007, the City of Marathon (the "City") Planning Commission (the "Commission") and on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2007, the City Council (the "Council") conducted properly advertised public hearings (the "Public Hearings") regarding the non-residential permit allocations for Period 2, Year 3 pursuant to Ordinance 2004-012 and 2006-29 of the City Code (the "Code").

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA, THAT:

- **Section 1.** The above recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein.
- **Section 2.** Based upon the information and documented evidence presented by City Staff and members of the public, the City Council hereby finds:
- (1) The Public Hearings were properly advertised and held, as required by law, and the Applicant(s) and all interested parties concerned in the matter were given an opportunity to be heard; and
- (2) Based upon the Staff Report attached as "Exhibit A", the Commission recommended that the City Council award Non-Residential Floor Area allocations to the applicant ranked one (1), as set forth in Attachment "A" to the Staff Report; and
- (3) Based upon the Staff Report and the Commission's recommendations, the Council approves the Non-Residential Floor Area allocations to the applicant ranked one (1) of the NROGO applications for Period 2, Year 3, as set forth in Attachment "A" to the Staff Report.
- **Section 3.** Based upon the above Findings of Fact, the Council does hereby make the following Conclusions of Law:
- (1) The NROGO applications for Period 2, Year 3 of NROGO have been processed in accordance with Ordinance 2004-12 and 2006-29 of the Code.

- (2) In rendering its decision, as reflected in this Resolution, the Council has:
  - (a) Accorded procedural due process;
  - (b) Observed the essential requirements of the law; and
  - (c) Supported its decision by substantial competent evidence of record.
- (3) The above allocations are awarded.

**Section 4.** That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
