In the Florida Keys Environmental Story, Annette Nielsen wrote, "Tropical hardwood hammocks are one of the most rare and unique plant communities in the United States. Distribution of these plant communities is restricted to the extreme southern tip of Florida and the Florida Keys...there are more than 120 species of tropical hardwood trees, shrubs and plants that grow in hammocks in our area. Of that number, 36 are currently listed as endangered or threatened with extinction." To protect the trees of the hardwood hammocks from threats like development, Marathon would like to establish an urban forestry program. The City originally wanted to initiate its urban forestry program by developing a master plan to encourage the proliferation of trees and elimination of invasive non-native plants. After thorough consideration, the City Council, now believes the best way to initiate an urban forestry program is through the completion of a pilot planting project to demonstrate the impact of trees to an urban area, to foster community support for an urban forestry program and to encourage the planting of additional trees. As such, the City is requesting permission to amend its project from a master plan to a pilot planting project which would involve planting an estimated 93 native trees including but not necessarily limited to Green Buttonwoods, Lignum Vitaes, Orange Geigers, Silver Buttonwoods, Thatch Palms, and Wild Tamarinds.
