A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA APPROVING AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (DEP) GRANT AGREEMENT NUMBER CZ915 ENTERED INTO ON AUGUST 25, 2008; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City acquired/leased conservation lands including lands in the Grassy Key area; and

WHEREAS, the City must monitor and manage the conservation lands under the conditions of the purchase/lease agreements; and

WHEREAS, DEP awarded the City a \$20,000 grant to conduct restoration of its Grassy Key conservation lands which the City has begun, and entered into Grant Agreement Number CZ915 on August 25, 2008;

WHEREAS, the City needs to redistribute grant funds within the project objectives to complete the project; and

WHEREAS, DEP forwarded Amendment No. 1 to Grant Agreement Number CZ915 which approves the necessary redistribution of grant funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARATHON, FLORIDA, THAT:

- **Section 1.** The above recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein.
- **Section 2**. The City Council hereby approves Amendment No. 1 to Grant Agreement Number CZ915 with the Department of Environmental Protection (a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A), together with such non-material changes as may be acceptable to the City Manager and approved as to form and legality by the City Attorney. The City hereby further authorizes the City Manager to execute the Grant Agreement.
 - **Section 3**. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Scope of Work Information

Grassy Key is one of the least developed and most natural areas in the City of Marathon, which is located about 57 miles east-northeast of Key West. Grassy Key's tropical hardwood hammocks provide habitat for a variety of wildlife species including the threatened white crowned pigeon and the indigo snake. However, the Key's hardwood hammocks, transitional wetlands and mangrove swamps are being threatened by invasive exotics and illegal dumping.

The City's Grassy Key Conservation Project seeks to protect the key's ecosystems through a four pronged effort: increased public awareness, education, planning and action. Specifically, the City will:

- 1) initiate a public awareness campaign to convey that Florida Keys ecosystems are fragile, important and in need of protection via educational materials, civic groups, newspaper ads and radio interviews;
- 2) conduct an educational outreach program aimed at local students at all levels; provide field trips, develop local environmental lesson plans, and talk to high school administrators about using environmental restoration efforts for community service;
- 3) develop goals and actions for the Grassy Key Restoration Project: identify site conditions, landscape restrictions, and long-term protection and management strategies; and
- 4) execute restoration plan: conduct pre-project monitoring, floristic inventories, secure permits, obtain equipment, conduct restoration, perform monitoring, prepare restoration reports, and photograph progress and completed actions. All restoration activities will take place on Grassy Key's upland property.

Objective 1: Convey to a variety of audiences the message that the ecosystems of the Florida Keys are fragile, important, interdependent and in need of protection.

Objective 2: Convey to future generations (grade school, middle school, and high school students) the message that the ecosystem of the Florida Keys are fragile, important, interdependent and in need of protection.

Task 1: Develop and teach environmental class aimed at grade school age students. (Field trips, Start Smart Program, Summer Camp)

Task 2: Develop lesson plan plans on local area environmental issues and concerns aimed at middle school students and furnish to local middle schools

Task 3: Talk to local area high schools about using environmental restoration efforts of this and other organizations as an opportunity for community service project hours

Deliverables: Copies of student education material and photographs.

Objective 3: Develop and execute Grassy Key Restoration Project Plan

Task 1: Develop a restoration plan Deliverable: Grassy Key Restoration Plan Task 2: Conduct restoration activities

Deliverables: Photographs of progress and completed restoration actions, a photo release form, and a copy of the

Grassy Key Restoration final report.

Contractual Services (\$19,600)

To execute the Grassy Key Restoration project, the City plans to hire consultants/contractors to aid the City Staff in the development of public outreach messages and materials, to support City Staff during public presentations on Grassy Key Restoration, to support City Staff in development of student lesson plans, to support student field trips, to develop the Grassy Key restoration plan, to support restoration execution, and to write the Grass Key Restoration final report. The City will also produce brochures, newsletters, and other documents and use local papers to conduct public outreach and advertise Grassy Key Restoration events.

Supplies (\$400)

To execute the Grass Key Restoration project, the City will purchase supplies like gloves, tools, herbicide, and other items needed to conduct restoration activities.

Match Funds:

Salaries (\$5000)

To execute the Grass Key Restoration project, the City Staff and volunteers will develop public outreach messages and materials, conduct public presentations on Grassy Key Restoration, develop student lesson plans, support student field trips, support development of Grassy Key restoration plan, execute Grassy Key Restoration activities, and oversee development of the Grassy Key Restoration final report.

Supplies (\$1000)

To execute the Grass Key Restoration project, the City will purchase supplies like gloves, tools, herbicide, items to mark restoration area, and other items needed to conduct restoration activities.

Contractual Services (\$14,000)

To execute the Grassy Key Restoration project the City plans to hire consultants/contractors to aid the City Staff in the development of public outreach messages and materials, to support City Staff during public presentations on Grassy Key Restoration, to support City Staff in development of student lesson plans, to support student field trips, to develop the Grassy Key restoration plan, to support restoration execution, and to write the Grass Key Restoration final report. The City will also produce brochures, newsletters, and other documents and use local papers to conduct public outreach and advertise Grassy Key Restoration events. A local company will donate a dumpster for restoration activities.
